We stand together with communities to create policies, environments and systems that support the goal that **every** child in Colorado has love, stability, support and opportunity.


What Guides Our Work

Grant Application Process

Grant Application Process

- Web-based, electronic application
- New applicants: account registration required
- Annual application deadlines:
 - First Friday in February at 5 PM
 - First Friday in August at 5 PM
 - Registration deadline two weeks before application deadline
- Review Process: approximately 4 months
