Support a pooled fund for food-relief in Colorado, reaching deeply into community partnerships and organizations addressing immediate needs for food.

Colorado Department of Health Care Policy and Financing Health Care Safety Net - Advanced Payment Fund

Working with partner foundations, The Colorado Health Foundation, Delta Dental of Colorado, Rocky Mountain Health Foundation and Rose Community Foundation, support establishment of an advanced payment loan fund to benefit Colorado's Health First Medicaid network/health care safety net and address challenges resulting from the spread of COVID-19 in Colorado.

Summer/Fall Youth Wellness in Communities and Schools

Support coalition building and planning efforts, being led by CEI and Early Milestones, to address the needs of elementary school and high school students who've been most impacted by COVID-19 disruptions in learning and social and emotional wellness.

Recovery Summer Coalition

Direct Cash Assistance Pilot Planning

Support a planning grant to identify and propose opportunities to address the economic mobility barriers faced by underserved communities in Colorado with direct cash transfers. Investigate the successes and failures of other direct cash models, analyze program design and integrate learnings from the Colorado Left Behind Workers Fund.

Impact Charitable

Left Behind Workers Fund

Together with trusted non-profit partners who serve lower wage workers and undocumented immigrants, Impact Charitable is hosting The Left Behind Workers Fund. This fund will disperse payments of \$1,000 to those impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic, with the goal of providing support to Colorado residents who do not have access to unemployment relief programs to address their most pressing needs (food, rent, bills, health, transportation, etc.).

Support Latino led/serving organizations, as well as Immigrant/Refugee led/serving organizations, to ensure continuity of critical organizations meeting the needs of Latino residents in Colorado as the impacts of COVID-19 continue across the state.

Public Health Educator Team

Support a team of trained community residents to work in partnership with Denver Public Health, through Lifespan Local, to provide education on COVID-19, engage with residents on vaccine hesitancy and acceptance, and promote vaccine access and uptake.

Support a relief fund to address economic, social and health consequences of the spread of the coronavirus in Colorado.

Keep the Lights on Colorado - Child Care Fund

The Keep the Lights on Colorado Fund has been established through a partnership of Mile High United Way, Healthier Child Care Colorado and the Early Childhood Council Leadership Alliance. Through this fund, childcare providers will receive direct financial assistance to cover rent, retain staff, pay for additional cleaning supplies and support utilities.

Other investors in this fund include the Colorado Department of Human Services, Buell Foundation, Gary Community Investments, The Women's Foundation of Colorado, and the Gates Family Foundation. The



Colorado Health Foundation is investing in unlicensed, family-friend-neighbor childcare homes through this fund (this rubric for distribution is still under development).

To date, the fund has received 481 applications requesting \$3.4 million in funds.
